CLARKSVILLE GAS DEPARTMENT

The Clarksville Gas Department delivers natural gas to over 27,000 customers through 844 miles of gas main line in four counties. Montgomery, Cheatham and Robertson counties in Tennessee and Christian county in Kentucky. Clarksville also delivers to the military installation, Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

Each year Clarksville purchases natural gas from Tennessee Gas Pipeline/Kinder Morgan (TGPL). It is received at Hwy 41-A and then transported through parallel 12" and 8" steel pipe along Hwy 41-A to Mericourt regulator station where it continues through 10" welded steel pipe to north Clarksville and Fort Campbell.

WHERE ARE PIPELINES LOCATED?

Natural gas pipelines are underground and unnoticeable to the public. Pipelines may be in your neighborhood, or even on your property. How do you know!?

One of the easiest ways to locate a pipeline is to recognize pipeline markers. The Clarksville Gas Department uses pipeline markers with high-visibility yellow paint, and installs the markers at road crossings, railroads and other points along the pipeline right-of-way. The markers identify the pipeline company and include telephone numbers to call to reach a company representative.

If a pipeline is on your property, the easement is the agreement that gives the pipeline company the right of access to build, operate and maintain the pipeline. Please remember, if a pipeline is on your property, the right-of-way must be kept clear of structures and trees. These restrictions are necessary for safety reasons. Please contact the

SUSPECTED PIPE LEAK?

There are several signs that can indicate a leak is present. These include distressed or dead vegetation, a hissing sound or an odor of gas in the pipeline right-of-way.

If you see, hear or smell any of these signs, please notify the Clarksville Gas Department at (931) 645-7422 during business hours or (931) 645-0116 after hours or for emergencies. A certified natural gas technician will be dispatched to investigate the situation.

Odor of gas - Natural gas is odorized to give it a distinctive "rotten egg" odor as a means of early gas leak detection. Workers in the natural gas industry add odorants and maintain an odorant level in the gas to make it detectable if there is a gas leak.

TENNESSEE ONE CALL SYSTEM

Clarksville participates in the very important and necessary **Tennessee One Call System, 800-351-1111**. This system is the "official" one-call service in Tennessee providing advance notification to operators of underground facilities such as gas, water, sewer, phone and cable. With prior notice from the one-call system, underground utility companies can locate and mark their respective lines before any digging, excavating or blasting projects begin. The service is available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week – it is free and it is the law (TCA 65-31-106).
