- Be Aware of Pipelines in Your Area
- Call Before You Dig
- Report Unusual Conditions
- Know What Steps to Take in an Emergency

Because natural gas pipelines are underground, the public often is unaware of their presence. Pipelines may be in their neighborhood, or even on private property. How do you know? One of the easiest ways to locate a pipeline is to recognize pipeline markers. The Cookeville Gas Department installs these high-visibility yellow markers at road crossings, railroads and other points along the pipeline right-of-way. The markers identify the pipeline company and include telephone numbers to call to reach a company representative. Be aware that not all pipeline locations are identified by markers.

Markers DO NOT Show:

- The depth of the pipelines
- The number of pipelines
- The exact location of the pipelines

Markers DO Show:

- The approximate location of the pipelines
- Our company's name
- Emergency phone number
